General Election - November 5, 2024

This calendar is intended to be a general-purpose resource for those seeking information for the General Election on November 5, 2024. We have tried to make it as useful and accurate as possible, but it should not be relied upon in place of the Elections and/or Government Codes for statutory guidance. August 9, 2024 E-88	<p>Submit Resolutions of Consolidation</p> <p>Last day for the governing body of a district, city, school or other political subdivision to file a request for consolidation with the November 2024 election with the Humboldt County Office of Elections. Copy sent to the Board of Supervisors. We encourage jurisdictions planning to have a measure on the ballot to contact the Office of Elections early in the process.</p> <p>Whenever resolutions calling for a measure to be placed on the ballot are filed, immediately after that filing date there will be a 10-day public inspection period. Documents will be on public display at the Office of Elections, 2426 6th Street, Eureka. During this period, any voter of the jurisdiction or the county elections official may seek a writ of mandate or an injunction requiring any or all materials to be amended or deleted.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">EC § 9190, 9380, 10401, 10402, 10403</p>
August 9, 2024 E-88	<p>Deadline for Tax Rate Statement for Bond Measure</p> <p>Last day to file tax rate statement for any bond measure appearing on the November ballot. This statement is filed with the Office of Elections.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">EC § 9401</p>
August 9, 2024 E-88	<p>Deadline for a Fiscal Impact Statement</p> <p>The Board of Supervisors may direct the county auditor by E-88 to review the measure and determine if the substance of the county ballot measure would affect the revenues or expenditures of the county. The statement may not exceed 500 words.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">EC § 9160</p>
August 14, 2024 E-83	<p>Deadline for Impartial Analysis for Measure</p> <p>County Counsel shall prepare an impartial analysis for county and school/special district measures, showing the effect of the measure on the existing law and the operation of the measure. The analysis may not exceed 500 words in length.</p> <p>City attorney shall prepare analysis of city measures.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">EC § 9160, 9313, 9280</p>

<p>August 15, 2025 – August 24, 2024 E-87 – E-73</p>	<p>10-day Public Inspection for Impartial Analyses</p> <p>During the public examination period, any voter of the jurisdiction in which the election is being held, or the county elections official, may seek a writ of mandate or an injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted. The writ of mandate or injunction request shall be filed no later than the end of the public examination period.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">EC § 9190, 9380</p>
<p>August 19, 2024 E-78</p>	<p>Deadline to File Arguments for Measures</p> <p>Arguments for or against any measure called for the election are due by 5 p.m. at the Office of Elections. Arguments are public after the deadline. Arguments shall not exceed 300 words.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">EC § 9162, 9316</p>
<p>August 20, 2024 – August 29, 2024 E-77 – E-68</p>	<p>10-day Public Inspection for Arguments</p> <p>During the public examination period, any voter of the jurisdiction in which the election is being held, or the county elections official, may seek a writ of mandate or an injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted. The writ of mandate or injunction request shall be filed no later than the end of the public examination period.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">EC § 9190, 9380</p>
<p>August 29 E-68</p>	<p>Deadline for Filing Rebuttals to Arguments for Measures</p> <p>Rebuttals to arguments for and against will be due by 5pm. Rebuttals are public after the deadline. Rebuttals shall not exceed 250 words.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">EC § 9167, 9317</p>
<p>August 30, 2024 - September 8, 2024 E-67 – E-58</p>	<p>10-day Public Inspection for Rebuttals</p> <p>During the public examination period, any voter of the jurisdiction in which the election is being held, or the county elections official, may seek a writ of mandate or an injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted. The writ of mandate or injunction request shall be filed no later than the end of the public examination period.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">EC § 9190, 9380</p>
<p>September 10 E-56</p>	<p>Print Deadline</p> <p>The County Elections office has set this deadline. All materials needed to appear in the County Voter Information Guide or on the Ballot must be in the Office of Elections by 5pm this date.</p>
